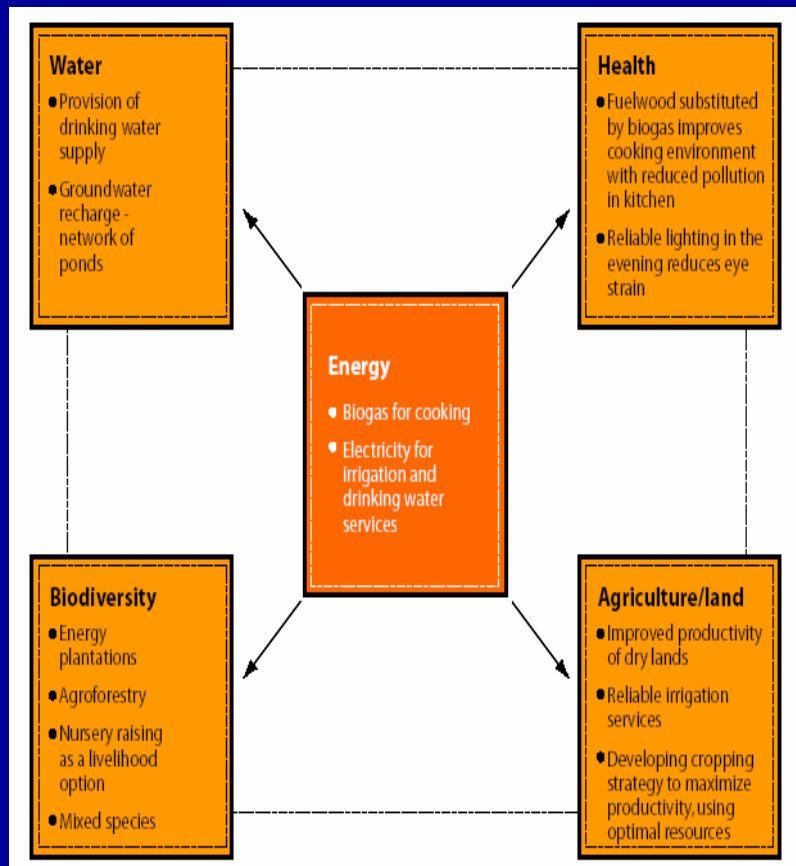
Just Semantics ?

Capacity Development: Impacts

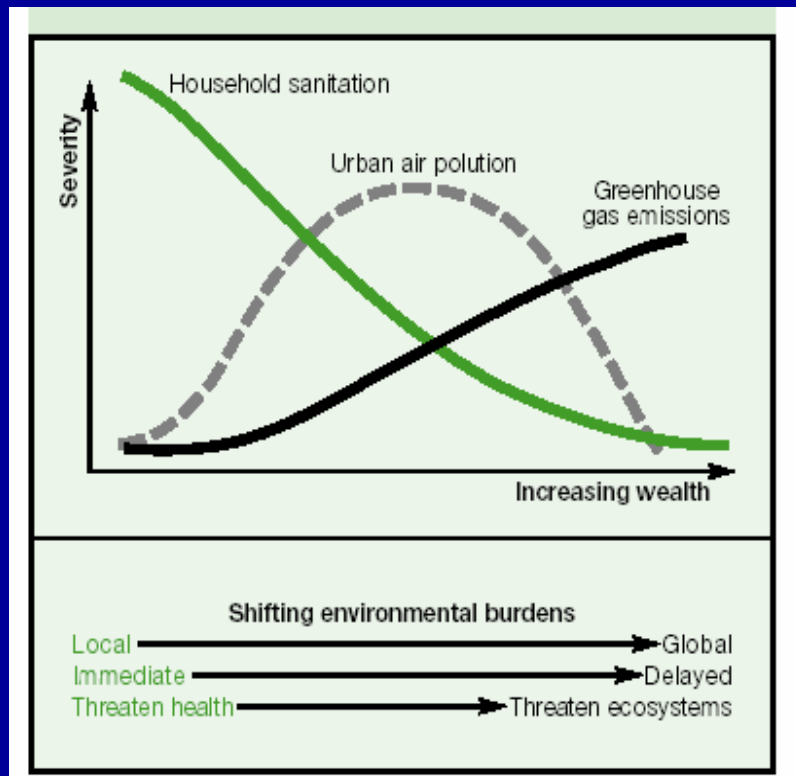


- Usha's WEHAB E&E Framework

Knowledge Management: General but non-trivial

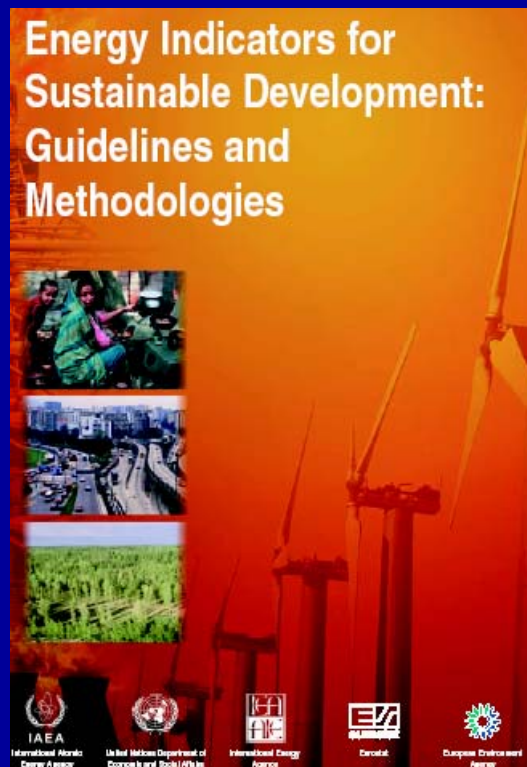


- Maximize win-wins and minimize trade-offs

- Point of departure for MDG 7 targets and indicators
