80% OF THE POOR'S EXPENDITURE ON ENERGY GOES FOR COOKING AND HEATING

COST OF ENERGY FOR THE POOR IS HIGHER THAN FOR OTHERS

JAKARTA DECLARATION ON MDGs IN ASIA PACIFIC, 5 AUGUST 2005

- 30. We recognise that the continuing high oil prices poses a major economic challenge to many developing countries in reaching MDGs targets. This issue needs to be addressed in a multi faceted manner including support for the development of alternative energy sources, promoting efficiency in energy sector and sustainability of supply.**
